To best prepare for severe weather such as a thunderstorm or tornados, here are some important definitions and tips:

<u>Severe Weather Watch:</u> Conditions are favorable for severe weather. Consider returning to your apartment if you are outside or in a common area of the community. To prepare for a potential storm, it is recommended removed knick-knacks and clutter from windowsills and to close windows and blinds.

Severe Weather Warning: Severe weather has been identified in the immediate vicinity. Take shelter immediately and remain calm. The best shelter area is within your apartment bathroom. Other shelter areas include internal hallways and common areas away from windows, stairwells, and the garage.

It is recommended to keep both a battery-operated radio and flashlight in your apartment. Stay tuned to local weather announcements on your TV or battery operated radio so you know when the threat has passed.


